The Urban League's Opportunity Brokers help a student out of poverty

Joshua (a nom de guerre) enrolled at the Trade Institute of Pittsburgh in February 2022 and was working two jobs at fast food restaurants trying to make ends meet. With a baby girl on the way, he was determined to change the trajectory of his life. With the support of the Urban League's Opportunity Brokers, Joshua was able to attend the Trade Institute of Pittsburgh and receive financial supports to assist him and his newborn baby with clothing and toiletry supplies while he was enrolled in the program. Joshua graduated from the Trade Institute of Pittsburgh in May 2022 and he is currently working at one of our Local Union Bricklayers now making \$27/hr.

Duquesne Family Support Center reaches out to Afghani refugees in their area

For about three months, Duquesne Family Support Center has been serving Pashto speaking refugees from Afghanistan who have recently relocated to our community. Scott Fisher met these families while making regularly scheduled food and diaper deliveries in Duquesne. They do not speak any English and there is not a text translator for the Pashto language. All communication has been with minimal words and hand gestures. In this course of time, staff were able to provide; food, diapers and other household needs such

as mattresses and cooking tools which he located at Shared Blessings Mission Store in Duquesne. Knowing that better communication would be required for the Duquesne Family Support Center to better serve these families. Duquesne Family Center collaborated with Shared Blessings Mission Store and First Presbyterian Church of Duquesne to host a "Recruitment Day" where there were Arabic and Pashto translators help them communicate with these populations. Having translators allowed our staff to fully communicate with the families.
