The Housing Specialist

The Housing Specialist will be responsible for providing housing support services to individuals and families seeking rental assistance for which the Urban League of Greater Pittsburgh has contracted. The guidelines of those services are governed by those contracts and the regulations promulgated by the funding sources and other internal directives.

Essential Functions

- Commitment to total quality and continuous improvement in the delivery of housing support and customer services.
- Provide housing support to families and individuals seeking new housing opportunities.
- Develop and maintain a list of leads for customers.
- Provide comprehensive housing support services in 1-on-1 sessions and group education support sessions, and fair housing enforcement and remedies.
- Collect customer situation information and sort out the housing problems from other related problems, making recommendations for actions by the customer according to sound principles of housing support documented in an Action Plan.
- Record all housing support activity information conscientiously and accurately.



- Perform computer assisted functions using Counselor Max or any other designated data collection system.
- Manage case load using sound case management guidelines documenting services provided and closing cases in a timely manner.
- Perform outreach and community workshops designed to recruit landlords who will support the Urban League of Greater Pittsburgh Rental Assistance Program
- Perform any duties as may be assigned by the Director of Housing, Program Manager/Compliance or their designee.
- Perform all customer follow ups for housing counselor.
- All other duties assigned.
