The Opportunity Broker will work in targeted communities to help move people from unemployed and underemployed to economic self-sufficiency. This role is a critical part of our One Pittsburgh Now strategy to reduce poverty in the region.

Essential Functions

- Assist in the development, roll and integration of a new formulated program in the Pittsburgh communities of Homewood, Hill District, North Side and Mon Valley.
- Establish a paradigm for building relations and networks within the community and region to social services, opportunities for education, training, and employment, with other community resources in targeted neighborhoods, and with community- based individuals/influencers.
- In conjunction with partnering organizations, discover, continually refresh, and promote employment opportunities, jobs skills acquisition, and effective resources to successfully direct participants towards household sustaining work options.
- Identifying, enlisting, coaching, retaining contact with and tracking progress of unemployed and underemployed working aged adults along a continuum of progress points:
 - Improved access to job readiness, training and/or employment as evidenced by elimination of crises and barriers, provision of or connection to requisite resource.



- o Improved individual career progression measured by promotions, hiring, raises, changes from less to more relevant fields, entrepreneurial ventures and growth, leadership positions.
- Utilize motivational interviewing to assess clients' needs and work with them to access resources to remove barriers to help them succeed.
- Ensures program compliance with contractual commitments to funder,
- Aligns service priorities with resourced training programs to maximize goal attainment, ensuring timely reporting and feedback effecting advocacy and policy standards.
